Business Items to Consider

4.A: Animal Science Learning Lab Proposal: Valon Jones/Sydney Cullison USD 461

The Commission will welcome Valon Jones and Sydney Cullison, USD 461, for a presentation and proposal to assist the school with the establishment of an Animal Science Learning Lab.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: N/A

4.B: Ordinance: Court Costs and Fees

Staff has been informed by the Municipal Court Judge that our Court Costs and Fees must be approved by Ordinance for a judgement to be ordered in court. For example, if the Judge does not order the City to be compensated for the cost of a license reinstatement, a cost of \$122, then we do not have the ability to collect this fee from a defendant. This suggested Ordinance change will also allow us to assign certain other court costs and fees to the defendant. This Ordinance change will require two Ordinances to be approved; Section 24-6, related to Court Costs and Fees, and Section 16-24, related to the actual fee section of our City Code. Therefore, two motions will be necessary to approve this change (Agenda items 4B and 4C).

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to adopt Ordinance 1736, amending Section 24-6 of the Neodesha City Code relating to Court Costs and Fees.

4.C: Ordinance: Amending Fee Ordinance; Court Costs and Fees

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to adopt Ordinance 1737, amending Section 16-24 of the Neodesha City Code relating to Court Costs and Fees.

4.D: Public Hearing: Dangerous Structures – 906 Church

On September 23, 2020, the Commission approved Resolution 20-13, to set a public hearing date, November 11, 2020, to show cause why the structures located at 906 Church should not be ordered repaired or demolished as unsafe or dangerous structures. For this agenda item, the Commission will conduct a public hearing for the property located at 906 Church.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: N/A

4.E: Resolution: Dangerous Structures – 906 Church

Depending on the outcome of agenda item 4D, The Commission is asked to approve Resolution 20-16, to declare the property as unsafe or dangerous, and directing the repair or removal of the structures, making the property safe and secure. It should be noted that the City is holding insurance proceeds for the demolition of the property. Staff will have an Ordinance prepared for the 2nd meeting in November, to order the demolition.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to approve Resolution 20-16 declaring the property located at 906 Church as unsafe or dangerous, and allow the property owner _____ days to repair or remove the structures and make the property safe and secure.

4.F: 2021 AirMedCare Agreement: Linda Barnes

For this agenda item, the Commission is asked to renew the AirMedCare insurance policy for the City. This coverage has been used numerous times in our community, to provide medical airlift services to our residents.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to renew the City's AirMedCare insurance policy for 2021 at a cost of ______.

4.G: 2021 Employee Health Insurance Plans

For this agenda item, the Commission will approve the employee health insurance plan for 2021. Our insurance is a mixture of being self-funded using Freedom Claims Management Inc. to manage the payments and filings for us, and a high deductible plan with Blue Cross Blue Shield.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to approve the Freedom 105 health insurance plan utilizing a high deductible Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas plan and a self-insured dental plan for 2021.

4.H: Sale or Lease of Communications Tower

This agenda item was tabled by the Commission on November 4, 2020, for continued work with Ms. Ladonna Bailey and the City Attorney. The City Attorney desires the City to make a firm decision on whether we will be selling or leasing the tower before completing the appropriate documents. Staff intends to finalize the direction with Ms. Ladonna prior to the Commission meeting, but the Commission will need to table this item for completion by the City Attorney.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to table this agenda item until _____.

4.1: Sale of Property to So Home Kids Foundation

The Commission is asked to consider deeding the Osage property to So Home Kids Foundation. The Commission may recall that this particular property is located immediately south and west of the So Home Kids facility, and deeding them the property will help clean up, or square, the property. Due to the fact the City has not mowed this property for years, and So Home Kids is a non-profit organization, the Commission is asked to consider gifting the property.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to approve the donation of the Osage property to So Home Kids Foundation.

4.J: Transfer of Property to the Neodesha Land Bank

For this agenda item, the Commission is asked to consider transferring the property commonly known as the City Pond into the Neodesha Land Bank. Staff has visited with Erica Johnson, and others, in the hope that we can pursue grant funding for improvements to the pond area, but to qualify, this property needs to be in the Land Bank.

Administrator Truelove addressed the Commission regarding the recent news of Valuet closing their business and the upcoming use of the City's communication tower. Eric Vogel from KwiKom was present to express interest in obtaining use of the tower. Discussion held. No action taken.

ORDINANCE NO. 1735

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 18-2 OF CHAPTER 18 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, DEALING WITH OPEN BURNING INSIDE THE CITY OF NEODESHA; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS:

Section One: Section 18-2, of Chapter 18, of the City of Neodesha Code shall be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18-2. - Open burning.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to burn rubbish as defined in section 36-399, grass, leaves shrubs, trash, refuse, yard waste, or any other material that makes an offensive odor or heavy dark smoke, in any street, alley, yard or vacant lot within the city except for recreational fires.
- (b) Recreational fires, defined as fires for pleasure, religious, ceremonial, cooking or other similar purposes, shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure, combustible material or property line, unless contained in a barbecue grill, smoker, barbecue pit or outdoor fireplace. Conditions which could cause a fire to spread to within 25 feet of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition. The Fire Chief may grant a written exception to the 25 feet distance from combustible material for a wood fired fireplace if the owner will install in advance of use a non-combustible surface for the fireplace to set on that is at least 15 feet from any combustible material. Gas fired outdoor fire places are exempt from meeting the 25 feet requirement. Although a gas fired outdoor fireplace may be placed on a wood deck, it can be no closer than 5 feet to a structure. Recreational fires shall be constantly attended by a person knowledgeable in the use of a fire extinguisher. A fully functional garden hose or a 4-A rating fire extinguisher shall be readily available for use at recreational fires. The term "outdoor fireplace" means a commercially designed and built outdoor fireplace with a protective spark arresting screen or a professionally built outdoor fireplace constructed of concrete or approved noncombustible materials. The term "barbecue pit" is defined as a pit that has a circumference no greater than three feet and must have a depth of at least one foot. A barbecue pit shall be constructed of concrete or other approved noncombustible material. The opening of the barbecue pit shall be protected in a secured manner by wire screen covers, constructed of not less than No. 9 gauge wire and not greater than one-inch mesh and must cover the entire circumference of the pit. Outdoor fireplaces and barbecue pits must be approved by the fire chief prior to their first use. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to violate any of the provisions of this subsection (b).
- (c) Discontinuance. The fire chief or assistant fire chief is authorized to require that recreational fires be immediately extinguished if such fires are determined to constitute a hazardous condition or are being used to burn rubbish, trash, refuse, yard waste or if the fire chief or assistant fire chief determines that smoke emissions are offensive to occupants of the surrounding property.

Section Two: Old Section 18-2, of Chapter 18, of the Code of the City of Neodesha is hereby repealed.

Section Three: EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its publication in the official city newspaper.

Commissioner Moffatt moved to approve Ordinance 1735 regarding open burning within the City of Neodesha. Seconded by Commissioner Nichol. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 20-14

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AND ESTABLISHING A NEODESHA LAND BANK POLICY MANUAL FOR THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS AND RESCINDING ANY LAND BANK POLICY MANUAL THAT MAY HAVE HERETOFORE BEEN ADOPTED BY THE NEODESHA CITY COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 12-101 provides that a city may exercise the powers of home rule in determination of local affairs, and the City of Neodesha is a City of the Second Class as defined by Kansas Statute; and (continued on next page)

WHEREAS, the management of the City of Neodesha regarding land management, and administrative procedures and policies are a permissible exercise of home rule powers, pursuant to K.S.A. 12-101; and

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 12-5902 provides that a city may establish a city land bank by adoption of an ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City of Neodesha Governing Body desires to adopt and establish a Land Bank Policy Manual to assist in remediating blighted and tax delinquent properties; and

WHEREAS, the City of Neodesha Governing Body believes that adopting a Land Bank Policy Manual is in the best interest the citizens of Neodesha and the City itself;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA:

The Land Bank Policy Manual for the City of Neodesha dated October 28, 2020 is hereby adopted effective as of the date of this resolution.

Commissioner Nichol moved to adopt Resolution 20-14 regarding Neodesha Land Bank Policy. Seconded by Commissioner Moffatt. Motion carried.

Purpose: The purpose of the animal science learning lab is to provide hands-on learning experiences for students related to animal science. This learning lab will compliment our Comprehensive Agricultural Pathway at the high school and has the potential of adding an additional pathway, Animal Science. Additionally, this learning lab will give students who do not have facilities/resources at home to have a Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) which is an intracurricular part to the Three Circle Agricultural Education model.

Project needs:

- Land for housing structure and grazing space for animals
- Approval from city to build animal housing structures and fencing within city limits
- Approval from city of housing of the following animals within city limits: goats, swine, cattle and chickens
 - This scope of this lab is to NOT be a production facility. This is strictly for a learning experience for students. Below I have included an estimate of the potential number of animals:

■ Chickens: 20-30 hens

Goats: 3-4 goats for kidding

■ Swine: 1-2 pigs for farrowing or show

■ Cattle: 1-2 steers/heifers for meat production

Examples of Projects:

- Jayhawk Linn High School
 - 4 acre lot with three fenced sections with a barn
 - House sheep year around for breeding and sell the lambs as an FFA fundraiser every year
 - Raise show pigs from April to sell at the fair in August
 - FFA members are responsible for the care of animals and keeping track of expenses
 - Program has been in place for 16 years
- Paola High School
 - Raised pigs and chickens for meat and hens for egg production
 - Have facilities for bringing in large animals for demonstrations such as Artificial insemination, vaccinations, castrations, etc.
 - Program is in the third year
- Northern Heights High School
 - Raises steers for meat production (2-4 per year depending on freezer space)
 - Raised 60 broiler chickens for meat production and hens for laying
 - In the process of having students sell the products they have raised at a local farmers market as a part of an SAE

Timeline:

- Phase 1: Preparation
 - Obtain land for learning lab
 - Obtain approval from the city
 - Estimated Time Completed: January 2021
- Phase 2: Financing
 - Research and apply for grants to build necessary structures for learning lab
 - Partner with local businesses on donating starting animals/materials
 - Estimated Time Completed: May 2021
- Phase 3: Design and Construction of Facilities
 - Design and develop a budget for structures needed
 - Construct fencing and buildings needed for the learning lab
 - o Estimated Time Completed: 2021-22 School Year
- Phase 4: Introducing Animals
 - Obtain eggs and/or chicks for hatching to being chicken flock
 - Obtain 2-3 goats
 - Estimated Time Completed: End of 2021-22 School year
- Phase 5: Raising Animals and Expanding
 - Obtain a pig or steer to raise
 - o Sell animals raised
 - Evaluate goals of the learning lab and make adjustments as necessary
 - Estimated Time Completed: Ongoing

Final Remarks: It's imperative that all know this learning lab has the potential to go many directions. Goals and accomplishments of the learning lab will largely be dependent upon student interest, capabilities and community needs and will change from year to year. Before moving forward, it is important that we receive approval from the city to house animals not approved to be in city limits and permits to build structures. We hope that you all see the value in this learning lab and how it can benefit our students in Agricultural Education at Neodesha High School.

ORDINANCE NO. 1736

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 24-6 OF CHAPTER 24 – MUNICIPAL COURT OF THE NEODESHA CITY CODE DEALING WITH MUNICIPAL COURT COSTS, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS:

<u>Section 1:</u> Section 24-6 of Chapter 24 – Municipal Court of the Neodesha City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 24-6 - Court Costs and Fees.

Court costs and fees to be paid by all defendants brought before the municipal court of the city, upon a plea or finding of guilty or a plea of nolo contendere, shall be established in section 16-24.

<u>Section 2:</u> Old Section 24-6, of Chapter 24 – Municipal Court of the Neodesha City Code and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect on December 1, 2020 after publication once in the official city newspaper.

ORDINANCE NO. 1737

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 16-24 OF CHAPTER 16 OF THE NEODESHA CITY CODE DEALING WITH MUNICIPAL COURT COSTS, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA, KANSAS:

Section 1: Section 16-24 of Chapter 16 of the Neodesha City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 16-24 – Court Costs and fees.

- (a) General costs. Whenever a defendant, in a case before the municipal court of the city is convicted of a violation of a municipal ordinance, or ordinances, or enters into a diversion agreement concerning a violation thereof, said defendant shall be assessed court costs in the amount of \$80 plus \$23.50 state-assessed fees. Said sum shall be in addition to any fine that is imposed by the court for said violation.
- (b) Driver's license reinstatement fees. The municipal court judge shall assess reinstatement costs in the amount of \$122 to any defendant whose driver's license was suspended for such person's failure to appear at a scheduled hearing or to whom a driver's license suspension was ordered in sentencing.
- (c) Diversion fees. Whenever a defendant enters into a diversion agreement concerning a violation, a diversion fee of \$200 shall be assessed by the municipal judge as part of sentencing. Said sum shall be in addition to any fine that is imposed by the court for said violation.
- (d) Attorney fees. As part of the court costs, the municipal judge shall also assess to the defendant, upon conviction, the amount of attorney fees and costs expended by the city if the defendant was represented by court-appointed counsel. In determining the amount and method of payment of such sum, the court shall take into account the financial resources of the defendant and the nature of the burden that payment of such sum will impose. A defendant who has been required to pay such sum and who is not willfully in default in the payment thereof may petition the court to waive payment of such sum or any unpaid portion thereof. If it appears to the satisfaction of the court that payment of the amount due will constitute a hardship on the defendant or the defendant's immediate family, the court may waive payment of all or a portion of the amount due, or modify the payment amount or due date.
- (e) *Incarceration fees*. The municipal court judge shall assess the jail costs the city incurs for each day, or portion thereof, that a convicted defendant is required to serve in jail in an amount equal to the rate the city is charged for the jail time by the Wilson County Department of Corrections.
- (f) Medical fees. Any costs incurred by the city for the provision of medical treatment of a defendant who is arrested and/or incarcerated pursuant to a city ordinance, or due to an order of the municipal court judge, shall be assessed against the defendant.
- (g) Expungement fees. In addition to any other costs, the municipal court shall assess an expungement processing fee of \$100 for each expungement petition filed with the municipal clerk.
- (h) Notice to appear fees. For a notice to appear issued to an individual charged in Neodesha Municipal Court, an additional fee of \$35 shall be charged to that individual to assist in the recovery of costs associated with enforcing the notice to appear.
- (i) Warrant fees. For a warrant issued to an individual charged in Neodesha Municipal Court for failure to appear for court, an additional fee of \$60 shall be charged to that individual to assist in the recovery of costs associated with law enforcement serving and enforcing the warrant.
- (j) Witness fees. All witnesses compelled to appear in the Municipal Court of the City of Neodesha, Kansas by subpoena or order of the Court shall be entitled to a witness fee of \$10 per day for any person compelled to appear in the Municipal Court. Additionally, witnesses shall be entitled to a mileage fee at a rate used by the

- State of Kansas actually driven in excess of fifteen (15) miles. All such fees shall be paid by the party calling the witness except in the event the defendant is found not guilty, then all fees shall be paid by the City.
- (k) If the defendant is unable to pay the costs assessed, there shall be and remain a judgment against the defendant, which may be enforced as a judgment for payment of money in civil cases.
- (1) For the purpose of determining the amount of court costs to be assessed in accordance with this article, if more than one complaint is filed against one individual arising out of the same incident, all such complaints shall be considered as one case for assessment purposes.

<u>Section 2:</u> Old Section 16-24, of Chapter 16 of the Neodesha City Code and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect on December 1, 2020 after publication once in the official city newspaper.

A RESOLUTION FINDING THAT THE STRUCTURE LOCATED ON LEGAL DESCRIPTION: LOTS TWENTY-ONE (21) AND TWENTY-TWO (22), BLOCK SIX (6) FORD'S ADDITION TO THE CITY OF NEODESHA, WILSON COUNTY, KANSAS, COMMONLY KNOWN AS 906 CHURCH, IS UNSAFE OR DANGEROUS AND DIRECTING THE STRUCTURE TO BE REPAIRED OR REMOVED AND THE PREMISES MADE SAFE AND SECURE.

WHEREAS, the Enforcing Officer of the City of Neodesha, Kansas did on the 30th day of January, 2020 file with the governing body of said City a statement in writing that a certain structure, hereinafter described, was unsafe and dangerous; and

WHEREAS, the governing body did by Resolution dated the 23rd day of September, 2020, fix the time and place of a hearing at which the owner, his or her agent, any lienholders of record and any occupant of such structure could appear and show cause why such structure should not be condemned and ordered repaired or demolished, and provided for giving notice thereof as provided by law; and

WHEREAS, such Resolution was published in the official city paper on the 1st day of October, 2020, and on the 8th day of October, 2020, and a copy of such Resolution was served on all persons entitled thereto in all respects as provided by law; and

WHEREAS, on this 11th day of November, 2020, the governing body has heard all evidence submitted by the enforcing officer of the City, the owners, agents, lienholders and occupants of such structure (having appeared or having failed to appear);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NEODESHA: that said governing body hereby finds that the structure located on Legal Description: LOTS TWENTY-ONE (21) AND TWENTY-TWO (22), BLOCK SIX (6) FORD'S ADDITION TO THE CITY OF NEODESHA, WILSON COUNTY, KANSAS, COMMONLY KNOWN AS 906 CHURCH, is unsafe and dangerous and hereby directs such structure to be removed and the premises made safe and secure. The owner of such structure is hereby given____ (__) days from the date of publication of this Resolution within which to commence the removal of such structure within the time stated or fails to diligently prosecute the same until the work is completed, said governing body will cause the structure to be razed and removed and the costs of such razing and removing, less salvage if any, to be assessed as a special assessment against the lot or parcel of land upon which the structure is located as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk shall cause this Resolution to be published once in the official city paper and a copy mailed to the owners, agents, lienholders and occupants as provided by law.
